PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE (By Larry Oshodi)

Dear Patriots,

Happy New Year! We return to school this semester with a number of changes to our facilities and instructional program that I wish to share with you. But first, we mourn the sudden loss of Captain (Ret.) Ben Whitener, our ROP Fire Science teacher who passed away on December 30th, 2012. Mr. Whitener was a young, highly intelligent and engaging educator who positively touched the lives of many students at Heritage, Freedom and Dozier-Libbey high schools. He was always cheerful and fully committed to the success of his students on and off-campus. Captain Whitener was a true local hero as a fire fighter and an educator who gave all to his beloved East Bay community. We will miss his dedication, positive energy and passion for student learning.

Our district's solar energy project is in full swing with construction at all schools including Heritage. Necessary underground work was done during the winter break, which required all parking lots to be closed down at that time. I apologize for the inconvenience caused to parents and students during this period. With that part over, the project will continue in phases, impacting only a section of the students' parking lot at each phase. During each phase, extra parking will be available at the temporary parking lot by our Softball fields (close to Adams Middle School). Clearly, this project will put some more strain on our daily traffic challenges. Thankfully, this will

only be for a short period of time. Furthermore, the anticipated savings from the project will benefit our students and community now and into the future. I ask that all parents and student-drivers plan accordingly, allowing extra time to park or drop-off and pick-up daily. I do appreciate your understanding and cooperation during this construction period.

Some of the staffing cuts we suffered at the beginning of the year due to the state budget crisis will be restored based on updated budget projections since the last general election. We are happy to welcome back to Heritage, Mrs. Lisa Sullivan, Assistant Principal for our SLC-A. With her return, SLC-A students currently assigned to other SLCs will be re-assigned to SLC-A for administrative support. Counseling support will not change as we will continue to function with three counselors on campus. SLC-A students will remain with the counselor they are currently assigned to. This change will take immediate effect and SLC-A students will soon be issued with new ID cards

Another change we are excited about is our Patriot Preview Night on Wednesday, January 30, 2013. Our staff has worked hard to replace our traditional Open House with an evening designed to truly benefit our students and parents. We want all students and parents to come on campus that evening (from 6:30 p.m.) to preview courses and programs we offer before students choose classes for the next school year. Course selection is scheduled for the week following the Preview Night, so it is very important that you and your student(s) take

advantage of this opportunity. Moreover, on the same evening we will have our popular Career Fair showcasing careers within our four Academies; we will also have our only Advanced Placement (AP) presentation for students interested in taking any of our rigorous AP courses next year. Finally, we will have a College Planning workshop to provide parents and students with the nuts and bolts of admissions as well as paying as little as possible for an excellent college education, even with a high total family income. So, please mark your calendars!

It is worth noting that these changes support our unchanging goal of providing a safe environment for all students to excel academically and socially. I must also note that another unchanging element we enjoy at Heritage is the unbelievable support of our parent community. As I've said in the past, our school continues to achieve at high levels because of the direct efforts of many parents who work tirelessly in support of our common goals. On behalf of our students and staff, I thank you all!

CAREER CENTER NEWS (By Michelle Snyder)

FAFSA

The FAFSA is used to apply for federal aid, state and some college aid. You apply on line at www.fafsa.ed.gov. You can apply beginning January 1, 2013—March 2, 2013 to qualify for federal and state aid. You will need a student and parent ID PIN and they suggest applying for that November through December. The FAFSA PIN is your personal identification number that you will use to electronically sign your application. You can also use this PIN to check the status of your application.

Cal Grant & DREAM ACT

A CAL Grant is the California state financial aid that can be used at most California schools. There is a two-part process in applying for a CAL Grant. 1—You must submit a CAL Grant verification form—HHS will do this for you electronically, if you complete and return the CAL Grant Verification form. 2—You must complete the 2013-2014 Federal Application for Federal Student Aid

(FAFSA) by March 2, 2013. Then CSAC will use the information from the FAFSA and GPA to determine your eligibility. Students who want to apply for the Cal DREAM ACT can pick up a verification form in the Career Center.

Local Scholarships

Heritage High School partners with HHS clubs, boosters and the community to offer scholarships to assist students in their goal of attending college after high school. The program is open to all graduating Heritage students pursuing post high school options. The application is available on the HHS website and in the Career Center and is due to the Career Center no later than Feb. 1st by 4 P.M. HHS will honor all recipients at our annual Scholarship Night on May 21st, in the Heritage Auditorium.

JANUARY: FAFSA filing period opens. Learn how to finance college at the Financial Aid Night for parents and students on Jan. 16th at 6:30 p.m. You could be the recipient of a \$1,000 scholarship.

FEBRUARY: Local Scholarship Applications are due Feb. 1st by 4 P.M. Check with the Career Center for LMC Admissions Workshop and Assessment dates.

APRIL: Expect to hear from colleges by mid–April. You can check your Cal Grant status at https://mygrantinfo.csac.ca.gov, once you have been notified by mail.

MAY: Plan to attend the Awards Night on May 9th and the Scholarship Night on May 21st. Request final transcripts at www.docufide.com.

JUNE: Graduation on the 8th at 9:30 a.m. in the Patriot Stadium.

ABI PARENT PORTAL INFORMATION (By Gina Kroner)

The Liberty Union High School District has transitioned to a new Student Information System, Parent Portal through ABI (Aeries Browser Interface) for parents. We think you will enjoy the new interface and access

to more timely information. The attendance in the portal is updated live-time, as are any assignment updates completed by the teachers.

How do I get an account?

Accounts were generated at the end of the first quarter. Any parent with an accurate email address listed in the student's electronic record received an email with the login process as soon as the portal was opened.

Do I have to have an email address listed to get an account?

Yes. If your email address is not listed in your child's record and/or you did not update it at walk-thru, please contact the school or email hhsattendance@luhsd.net to have that information listed in your child's electronic record. If you do not have an email account, you can create one for free through G-mail.

Can my son/daughter sign up for an account?

Yes, your son/daughter can sign up to access his/her own account. To do so, your son or daughter's email address should be listed in the student's record. The view for a student is identical to that of a parent, so they will want to select "Student" when asked what type of account they want to create.

Are there resources available to me so I know what to do?

The ABI Parent Portal website was completed with FAQs, video instructions, and other documentation to assist you in navigating the portal. The interface is intuitive, so I think you will really enjoy the new service.

Who do I contact if I need assistance?

If you need assistance, you may contact Heritage directly; however, we request that you first go to the online resources on the **Parent Info** tab to address your questions.

CAFETERIA COMPUTERIZED PAYMENT SYSTEM

The Liberty Union High School District recently adopted the Nutrikids computerized Point-of-Sale payment system for meals purchased in the district's cafeterias. Some parents may be familiar with a similar system that is used by some of the elementary schools.

Each student has their own meal account based on their Student ID number. Transactions will only require that the student swipe their ID card across a scanner that is located at each cashier terminal.

The posting of credits to your child's account is done on the Nutrikids website by using a credit card or via Paypal. A link to nutrikids.com is on the Parent Portal, and also on the HHS website. You will be able to view your child's meal purchases online, by accessing your account on the Nutrikids website. We are encouraging you to create an account for your child, but the system is flexible, so you may still pay for meals with cash.

If your child qualifies for Free-or-Reduced price lunches or breakfasts, this information is securely contained within the system and the transaction will be processed just as it is for all other students.

If you are concerned about a food allergy that your child has, please provide the cafeteria with this information. A warning will appear on the cashier's screen for a quick review of the items on the student's meal tray.

TRANSCRIPTS (By Michelle Snyder)

Need a Transcript? Visit the HHS website at www.luhsd.net/heritage and visit the Counselor page under the Student Info tab. There are two options for transcript requests - Electronic or Other. The electronic process is quick, easy and provides a

tracking system. The other process requires printing out a completed form, turning in the form to the Registrar for processing, then pick up/mail out. There is no tracking method with this process.
