Water Polo ~ Basketball



Whitney earned both the Athlete of the Year and the Marine Corps Most Distinguished Athlete Award.

Whitney Bell was born and raised in Oakley. She started her education at Laurel Elementary School and O'Hara Park Middle School before attending Freedom High School. Whitney was the youngest of three in an athletic family and learned to compete at a young age. Her passion was sports, and at Freedom she played basketball and water polo. In basketball, she quickly moved up the ranks and became the JV Team Captain and MVP as a freshman. During her sophomore year, she became the point guard of the varsity team, was the leading scorer on the team, and was recognized by the BVAL with an Honorable Mention. In her junior and senior seasons, she was recognized by the BVAL as part of the All-Star 2nd Team and won numerous awards including: West Coast Jamboree All-Tournament Team Member, Palm Springs Tournament All-Tournament Team Member, and the Fortuna Tournament All-Team Member. In water polo, Whitney was an integral part of Freedom finding its competitive identity as she led the team to multiple playoff berths. She played four years of water polo and was recognized with all-team recognition in her sophomore, junior, and senior seasons as well as earning the team MVP award. In her junior year, she was named the BVAL MVP. All of her athletic success culminated with her selection as Freedom Athlete of the Year and the Marine Corps Most Distinguished Athlete Award.

After high school, she decided to attend Sierra College in Rocklin and played collegiate water polo where she earned All-State recognition as a two time Conference Defensive Player of the Year, two time All-Conference team member, and two time All-Junior College NorCal team member.

After college, she came back to Freedom in 2010 to be an assistant coach, and she led the Freedom water polo team back to the playoffs.

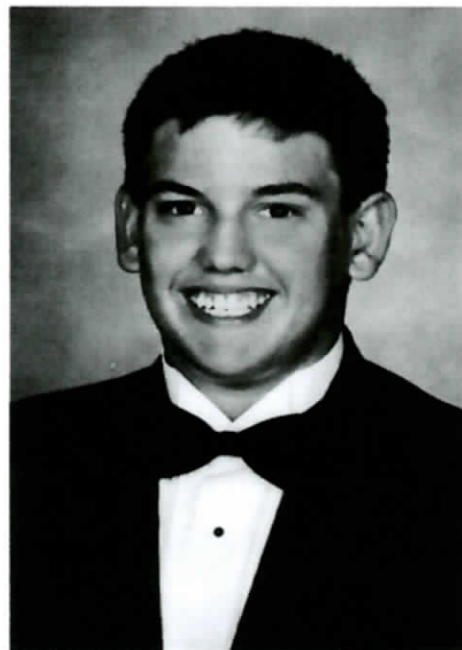
Robert (Bob) Harris

Athlete

Tennis ~ Water Polo

Robert (Bob) Harris was born and raised in Brentwood. He started his education in the Brentwood School District attending Ron Nunn Elementary School and Bristow Middle School before coming to Freedom High School. From an early age, his parents introduced him to the sport of tennis, and he spent many weekends at the court with his family learning the sport long before his first day of high school. During his freshman year, he explored his athletic possibilities and decided to play water polo and tennis. From the very first day of tennis tryouts, he established himself as arguably the best male tennis player in Freedom's history and one of the premier players in all of East County. In his freshman year, he played in the #2 and #3 positions and was chosen by his teammates as the Most Valuable Player. He continued his legacy during his sophomore through senior seasons playing in the #1 tennis-position and being chosen MVP in each of those seasons, as well. During this time period of BVAL history, tennis was dominated by De La Salle, yet he still achieved all-league recognition in both singles and doubles during his sophomore and junior years. He culminated his tennis career as the BVAL Singles Champion achieving victory in a three-set match against a previously undefeated opponent and was the first male tennis athlete to ever represent Freedom at the North Coast Section Championships.

Paul Ramey

Basketball ~ Water Polo

Paul Ramey turned his high school career into one of a trailblazer. After attending Liberty High School as a freshman, he decided that the challenge of being the first class at the new Heritage High School was something that he could not pass up. Little did he know that when he made that decision that he was about to lay the foundation that the school and the athletic department would use to build tremendous academic and athletic success in the very near future.

After playing JV basketball his sophomore year, when Heritage had no varsity teams, Paul went on to earn four letters during his junior and senior years – two each in water polo and basketball. In water polo he was named Captain during both of those varsity seasons, earned The Coaches Award and was named the team's Defensive MVP.

On the basketball court, Paul's true leadership qualities stood out to both his teammates and his coaches as he was named Team Captain during all three years. He led not only by example but by words, intensity and teamwork. He was often found by the coaches listening intently to everything they had to say and then relaying those messages in his own way to his teammates. This helped to build tremendous team chemistry within the team itself and led to success on the court because of it. During the Patriots first varsity season in 2006-2007, Paul and his team captured the Inaugural Bear Creek Invitational defeating bigger and more experienced competition with team work and heart! He was named to the

All-Tournament Team. This was to become the beginning of an amazing run by the team. They finished the season 13-13 and just missed the NCS playoffs on the final night of the season but made it a pledge to not let that happen during the following season. And it did not!

The season began with the team winning the McKinleyville Tip-Off Tournament. Paul was named the MVP of the tournament for his play and his leadership. Several weeks later the Patriots captured another tournament title at the Don Nelson Classic at Dublin High School, and Paul was named to the All-Tournament Team. The team went on to finish the season with a 20-7 record and the #2 seed in the North Coast Section playoffs. At the end of the season Paul was named to the BVAL All-League Team.

Paul was twice named the Contra Costa Times Player of the Week and Heritage High School's Athlete of the Month. Finally, he capped his career by being named Heritage High School's first Athlete of the Year. He was truly one of those athletes that every successful team needs and every coach would love to have!

Following graduation Paul attended Sonoma State University where he was involved in Student Government. He was Student Body Vice-President in 2011, received the Congressional Scholarship from the Panetta Institute in 2012, and graduated Magna Cum Laude in 2013 with degrees in Political Science and Finance. Later on this year he plans to marry his high school sweetheart, Karen Paniagua.

Baseball ~ Basketball

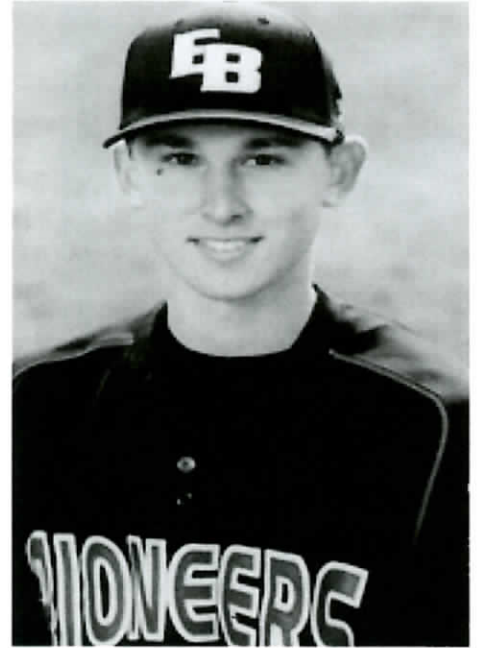
Eddie Rettagliata was born and raised in Oakley. He started his education at Vintage Parkway Elementary before going to O'Hara Park Middle School and then to Freedom High School. Eddie was a two-sport athlete who excelled in basketball and baseball.

In basketball he started his career as a recognized leader, earning the honor of being Team Captain. By the time he was a junior, he was a key player in the varsity lineup and garnered all-tournament selections at the Alhambra Classic in Martinez and the Mid-Valley Classic in Concord. In his senior season, he continued to push himself to maximize his potential and was recognized by his coaches and teammates as the team MVP.

Although Eddie had a successful basketball career, his true passion was baseball, and that is where he set the stage for athletic greatness. He played all four years as a varsity player for the Falcons and was named the Defensive Player of the Year by his team. In his senior season he was the team MVP and was recognized by the Bay Valley Athletic League as a 2nd Team Selection.

As a result of his outstanding high school career, Eddie continued to play baseball at Los Medanos College and was an All-Conference player there before continuing his playing career at Cal State Monterey Bay and Cal State East Bay. He was recognized as an All-Academic Athlete and received the Academic Achievement Division II Athletic Award from the NCAA.

Drew Torres

Athlete ~ Coach
Basketball ~ Rugby



Drew has led the Falcons to seven consecutive NCS playoff appearances.

Drew Torres attended Liberty Union High from 1992-1996. During those four years, Drew was an outstanding basketball player. After graduating from Liberty in 1996, he attended Los Medanos College and then California State University Chico where he earned a Bachelor of Arts in Physical Education and a Master's Degree in Coaching and Administration. He is currently a Physical Education teacher and the Head Varsity Basketball coach at Freedom High School.

In high school Drew played basketball all four years (two as a varsity player). During his freshmen year, he earned MVP Frosh Basketball; sophomore year, MVP Junior Varsity Basketball; junior and senior years, MVP Varsity Basketball and 1st Team All-BVAL (both years).

After high school, Drew was a member of the Los Medanos College Basketball team from 1996-1998, where he won the Coaches Award and LMC Outstanding Basketball Player. He was also an Athlete of the Year nominee. He transferred to California State University Chico where he played basketball from 1999-2001 earning Most Inspirational Player. He was also an outstanding rugby player on the Chico Men's Rugby Club that won the 2002 National Championship.

Drew went on to coach at Antioch High where he holds the record for number of wins in a season (22) guiding the team to consecutive NCS playoff appearances from 2005 to 2007.

Currently, Drew teaches Physical Education and is in his 7th year as Head Varsity Basketball Coach at Freedom High School. He has changed the culture, building the program into one with a winning tradition. Drew has led the Falcons to seven consecutive NCS playoff appearances (2008-2015). From 2011-2015, the Falcons qualified for NorCal, making it to second place in 2013-14. Drew was BVAL Winter Coach of the Year in 2012-2013, and holds the record for most Freedom wins (26) in a season (2013-2014). The past two years the Falcons have been BVAL champions; this year going undefeated 10-0. Drew has mentored many athletes who have gone on to play at the college level.

The Briseno Family

Athletes

From 1965 to the present, the community of Brentwood has been positively affected by the presence of the Briseno family. The three siblings, Joe, Homer and Viola, were all born in Martinez, California, and were raised in the Brentwood area by their parents, Jose and Viola. All three attended Brentwood Elementary School, Edna Hill Middle School, and graduated from Liberty Union High School. All three were active in sports and school activities at Edna Hill School, and each took different paths through Liberty Union High School and their careers.

Joe Briseno is the oldest brother, and he entered Liberty Union High School in 1972 and graduated in 1976. He attended Los Medanos Community College from 1976-1978 and then transferred to San Francisco State University and graduated in 1981 with a degree in psychology. He currently serves as a probation officer for Contra Costa County. In high school Joe played both football and baseball. He lettered in Frosh and JV football, but it was baseball where Joe really excelled. He lettered in Frosh, JV, and two years on varsity. He was the starting centerfielder for the varsity team. He earned All-League in the East Diablo Athletic League and received the Antioch Ledger All-County Baseball recognition award. He led the varsity team in batting and fielding in 1976 and was a member of the Block "L" Society during his junior and senior years. In the community Joe served on the Brentwood Pony League Board of Directors from 2000-2004. He was also the manager/coach of the Contra Costa Cubs of the Semi-Pro Baseball League from 1982-1991. From 1999 to 2009 he served in various coaching capacities for the Pinto, Mustang, Bronco, Pony and Brentwood Pony traveling teams. He also coached in the Immaculate Heart of Mary CYO Basketball League for seven years. Joe has been employed for 30 years as a Deputy Probation Officer for the Contra Costa Probation Department that provides services to delinquent children and their families in the east county. He was chosen Contra Costa Deputy Probation Officer of the Year in 1999, and he received an award for the Outstanding Service/Contributor by the Juvenile Probation Office in 2007.

Homer Briseno entered Liberty Union in 1974 and graduated in 1978. He attended Los Medanos and Reedley Community Colleges and then Fresno State University from 1979-1982. He is currently an iron worker for Local Union 377. In high school Homer participated in freshman basketball, track and field for four years, and cross country for two years. He was in Block "L" Society from 1975-1978. Homer excelled in track as a leader and participant. He was Captain of the varsity cross country team in 1978 and Co-Captain for the varsity track team. He received the prestigious Parker Robb Athletic Award for track. Homer participated in the "Meet of Champions" in 1977 and 1978 in the mile relay (4th place), the long jump (2nd place), and the triple jump (4th place). In 1977 and 1978 he qualified and participated in the California State Meet in those three events. In the West Coast Relays Open Division he took 3rd place in the long jump, and in the Sacramento Relays he also took 3rd. He broke the school record in the long and triple jumps in 1978. He was on the Los Medanos Track and Field team, and he served as the Assistant Track Coach at Liberty Union from 1981-1982. Homer was in the US Navy and served as a JET Engine Technician. He served in the Battle "E" ribbon squadron VA-22 and was granted the Expeditionary Medal USN. He received an "Honorable Discharge."

Viola Briseno is known as "Chach" by her friends and family. She is the youngest sibling and entered Liberty Union in 1976 and graduated in 1979. She attended Humboldt State University from 1980-1982. She is a self-taught chef for over 30 years and the owner of her own restaurant in Provincetown, Cape Cod, Massachusetts named "Chach." Her restaurant has been written up in the New York Times, the Cape Cod Life, Yankee Magazine and the Boston Globe. Viola participated in JV basketball, volleyball and track and field in her 9th and 10th grade years. In 1978-1979 she was a member of the varsity teams of basketball, volleyball and track as well as a member of the Block "L" Society. She was a valuable contributor as a discus and shot putter for the 1978 North Coast Section 2A Championship Team that was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1998.

Although some schools have decades of waiting before finding success at league and section levels, Freedom found success early in its existence with the Freedom softball program.
