Subject: Graduation Requirements for Comprehensive
High Schools

To qualify for a diploma of graduation, a student must pass 270 semester units in grades 9 through 12. One hundred fifty-five (155) of those semester units must be selected in accordance with the content or subject area minimum requirements indicated below. All students will follow the program shown.

Where a course is applicable to more than one subject area requirement, the units will be counted only once.

Standards and Benchmarks

The Standards and Assessment Program provides a clear definition of the knowledge and skills that students must demonstrate in all subject areas in order to graduate from high school. Students are expected to achieve the identified standards within the coursework required for graduation.

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Each year thereafter, each student completing grade 12 shall successfully pass the state exit examinations in language arts and mathematics as a condition of high school graduation. Students shall take the exit examination in grade 10 and may take the examination during each subsequent administration until each section of the examination has been passed.

Supplemental instruction will be required of any student who does not demonstrate "sufficient progress" toward passing standardized assessments.

Pupils who have not passed one or both parts of California High School Exit Exam by the end of grade 12 are entitled to receive intensive instruction and service for up to two consecutive academic years after completion of grade 12 or until they pass both parts of the California High School Exit Exam.

Fourth Year Limitation

Students may earn no more than 90 units from all sources in the calendar year prior to their graduation (September-June). Appeals for exception to this policy may be approved by the site principal under special circumstances.
